SOUTH AMERICA

ARGENTINA In Argentina, WEP includes 25 hours of Spanish language as well as optional trips to Iguazu falls and Ushuaia, the most southern point before Antarctica.

Home to tango, 'los gauchos', soccer and the 'asado' (Argentine barbeque), Argentina is famous for its beef and many delectable foods, such as 'alfajores' (sweet pastry filled with 'dulce de leche' and covered with chocolate) and 'empanadas' (pastry filled with meat or chicken, onion, capsicum and egg).

Argentines place a premium on individuality and aspire to incorporate the values associated with the gaucho (a legendary plainsman who is independent, brave, athletic, loyal, and generous) into their lives. Argentines express their concern for others with 'gauchadas', gaucho-like acts of generosity, such as going out of one's way to help someone.

BRAZIL The largest and most populous country in South America is a land of Carnival, futebol (soccer), samba, bossa nova, Jiu Jitsu and the Amazon.

Brazilians are open, talkative, friendly and easy-going people who love to play soccer and dance. Brazilians also work hard, are very creative and face life with persistent joy and intensity. The official language is Portuguese.

CHILE The most southern country in the world is famous for Patagonia, Torres del Paine, Easter Island, alpacas, llamas, poet Pablo Neruda (winner of Nobel Peace Prize for Literature) and outdoor festivals.

Chileans are friendly, hospitable, proud people and family life is highly valued and celebrated often.
